SURVEYOR-GENERAL (AERIAL PHOTOGRAPHS AND LIBRARY) NOTICE, 1980

IT is hereby notified, for public information, that the following provisions shall apply in respect of the sale of aerial photographs, diapositives, enlargements of aerial photographs and mosaics, the use of the Surveyor-General's library of aerial photography and the loan of aerial survey film, with effect from 1st July, 1980:—

1. This notice may be cited as the Surveyor-General (Aerial Photographs and Library) Notice, 1980.

2. The price of aerial photographs, diapositives, enlargements of aerial photographs and mosaics sold by the Surveyor-General shall be according to the scale set out in the Schedule.

3. Any person who wishes to consult the Surveyor-General's library of aerial photographs, but does not wish to purchase a photograph, will be required to pay a search fee of 25 cents per pair of photographs used.

4. (1) The Surveyor-General may lend films of aerial photographs to a borrower approved by him, subject to the following conditions—

- the borrower shall not remove the film from Zimbabwe;
- a film shall not be issued on loan for any period exceeding seven days at any time;

- the collection of the film from the Surveyor-General and the return of the film thereto shall be the responsibility of the borrower;
- the borrower shall not mark, annotate or deface in any manner the film on loan to him. When returning such film, the borrower shall report any damage which may have occurred;
- the borrower shall be liable to replace, in the manner specified by the Surveyor-General, any film borrowed by him if such film is lost or damaged in any way;
- an application for permission to borrow the film shall be made in writing to the Surveyor-General, and the applicant shall specify the film-numbers of the actual frames to be copied;
- a fee shall be paid in respect of each copy made, irrespective of the nature of such copy, at the rate of 25 cents per copy:

Provided that no such fee shall be payable if the photographs are to be used for work which is to be done on behalf of the State;

- if the borrower wishes to make prints for the purpose of preparing a mosaic, he shall, when applying for permission to borrow the film, notify his intention to do so;
- if the borrower wishes to prepare, and to sell to the public, copies of a map prepared from such film, he shall, when applying for permission to borrow the film, notify his intention to do so, the scale of the proposed map and the limits of the area to be mapped.

(2) Nothing contained in this section shall be construed to mean that the Surveyor-General shall be obliged to lend film of aerial photographs to any borrower, whether approved or not.

(3) The lending of film of aerial photographs shall, at all times, be at the discretion of the Surveyor-General, who, when granting permission to an approved borrower, may stipulate such conditions additional to those listed in subsection (1) as he may deem fit.

5. The Surveyor-General (Aerial Photographs and Library) Notice, 1977, published in Rhodesia Notice 720 of 1977, and the Surveyor-General (Aerial Photographs and Library) (Amendment) (No. 3) Notice, 1979, published in General Notice 899 of 1979, are repealed.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AS AT THE 31ST DECEMBER, 1979

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (as 1978)

The principal accounting policies of the University, which are set out below, have been consistently followed in all material aspects.

(a) *Accounting convention*

These financial statements are prepared in terms of the Historical Cost Convention. Procedures are not adopted to reflect the impact on the financial statements of specific price-changes or changes in the general level of prices.

(b) *Depreciation of fixed assets (Schedule 7)*

The University's chief source of general revenue is a triennial block grant from the Government of Rhodesia, whose policy it is to exclude from the grant any provision for depreciation of fixed assets. Consequently, such depreciation may be charged only against the general capital account, which consists almost entirely of grants and donations for the acquisition of fixed assets.

Depreciation is not written off land or permanent buildings; for other fixed assets depreciation is calculated to write off the cost (or acquisition value) of each asset in equal annual instalments over its expected useful life. Once fully depreciated, such assets are automatically written off in the following year. Library books and exhibits are written off in the year of acquisition.

(c) *Funds for specific purposes (Schedule 5)*

In general, funds for specific purposes are included in the accounts without accruals.

(d) *Foreign currency*

Foreign currencies are converted at the rates ruling at the dates of transactions, and foreign balances are converted at the approximate rates ruling at the year-end.

(e) *Pension funds*

Pensions are provided for employees by separate pension funds to which the University and employees contribute.

(f) *International accounting standards*

These accounts are at variance with the requirements, in that buildings are not depreciated.

2. GENERAL REVENUE ACCOUNT

In terms of an agreement with the Government, the Treasury is empowered to review the annual block grant in the light of audited results. This review will have a direct bearing on the 1980 grant (1978 Treasury vote adjustment \$620 000, Schedule 3).

3. CONTINGENT LIABILITY

Under a staff housing-loans guarantee scheme, there exists a contingent liability of \$106 341 (1978 \$85 217) in respect of guarantees furnished to a building-society.

4. DONATED ASSETS

Estimated total value of accountable assets in use which have been donated to the University and received by the council for 1979 is \$17 440.

- the Manual of Style for the Drafting and Preparation of Copy, published by the Department of Printing and Stationery;

which two booklets are intended for complementary use.

In these conditions, other than where a particular kind of copy is specified, "copy" means copy for all matter contained in the *Gazette* itself and for subsidiary legislation issued as supplements to the *Gazette*.

1. (1) Other than by prior arrangement, only original typing is accepted.

(2) Carbon-copies are not normally acceptable, other than in cases where the original typing has to be legally retained elsewhere, as, for example, in the case of a proclamation.

(2) Any corrections or alterations made by the originator must be clearly effected in blue or black ink:

Provided that any copy containing extensive alterations will be rejected.

3. (1) Copy must appear on one side only of each sheet of paper.

(2) Except as is provided in subsection (2) of section 8, paper must not exceed 210 millimetres in width.

(3) If copy comprises two or more sheets of paper, all sheets must be numbered consecutively, in arabic figures, preferably in the top right-hand corner.
