STATEMENT BY THE CHAIRMAN Mr. R. E. Parke

The past year witnessed a decrease in the rate of growth of all the major productive sectors of the economy but the good tobacco season and greatly improved prices will more than offset the lower earnings realised by other export crops, cotton in particular. The fall in the output of most minerals and metals has been more than balanced by a substantial rise in gold production.

Financial sector lending rose with the increased availability of external credit lines negotiated under the structural adjustment programme and because of higher prices for capital equipment. However, the doubling of crude oil prices will seriously curtail Zimbabwe's ability to increase the availability of imports required to support structural adjustment. It is, therefore, considered essential to adopt a conservative outlook for the coming year.

A significant milestone for the Zimbank Group in 1990 was the establishment of Zimbank Botswana Limited—the first occasion that the Group has operated in a neighbouring SADCC country. The Group's expansion into Botswana is in line with the Government's aim of promoting economic and commercial links among SADCC countries and consideration will be given to similar ventures in other SADCC countries as suitable opportunities arise. Another breakthrough for the Group was the growth in its consolidated assets which, for the first time, exceed \$2 billion.

GROUP RESULTS

I am pleased to report that all Group Companies improved their results. Consolidated Group Income attributable to shareholders, after providing for tax and transfers to inner reserves, amounted to \$18,190 million, 30% above last year's \$13,960 million. Given the impact on the Group of the lower margins resulting from recent changes in monetary policy, the results are very satisfactory. Management and Staff throughout the Group are to be congratulated on responding effectively to this new economic environment, which will become increasingly competitive as the Government's structural adjustment programme is implemented. Earnings per share amounted to 126,56 cents compared to 97,12 cents per share last year, a 30% increase.

DIVIDEND

The capital costs associated with the on-going expansion of the Bank's branch network and general upgrading of facilities necessitate a further strengthening of Group reserves and a continued prudent dividend policy. Accordingly, \$11,640 million has been placed to revenue reserves. The Directors have proposed a final dividend of 23 cents per share payable to shareholders registered in the books of the Company at the close of business on 21 December 1990. The proposed total dividend of 36,5 cents per share compares with the 33 cents per share paid last year or, after adjustment for last year's Rights Issue, 32,68 cents per share. The proposed dividend cover is 3,1.

CAPITAL AND RESERVES

The authorised and issued share capital remained unchanged at \$20 million and \$16,361 million, respectively. Including the amount transferred to revenue reserve and the \$578 000 retained this year, total reserves amounted to \$71,103 million. Group shareholders' funds totalled \$87,464 million on 30 September 1990, an increase of \$12,218 million or 16% on last year. Net asset value per share increased from \$4,60 to \$5,35. The continuing rapid growth of the Group and the need to ensure capital ratios conform to intenationally acceptable prudential standards make it essential to strengthen again its capital base. The majority shareholder has been appraised of the need for a further capital injection and it is planned to undertake this exercise in the coming year.

CONSOLIDATED GROUP ASSETS

The impressive progress of the Group is clearly demonstrated by the substantial 43% growth in consolidated Group Assets from \$1 540 million on 30 September 1989 to \$2 208 million on the same date this year.

ZIMBABWE BANKING CORPORATION LIMITED

The Commercial Bank enjoyed another satisfactory year with after-tax distributable income increasing from \$12,396 million to \$15.343 million, up by 24%. In light of the squeeze on margins and substantial salary awards in July, these results are commendable. As these factors will influence results for the whole of next year it will difficult to maintain this rate of increase. It is gratifying that all sectors of the Bank's operations contributed to the increased earnings. Assets and liabilities grew by 34% from \$972 million at 30 September 1989 to a record \$1 302 million on 30 September 1990. Deposits, up \$225 million to \$1 048 million, and advances, up \$139 million to \$774 million, also reached record levels.

The Mount Darwin Branch was formally opened in January 1990 by the Vice-President, the Honourable Dr. J. M. Nkomo. The new Chitungwiza Branch, situated in that town's new Shopping Centre complex opened for business on 25 October 1990, bringing much needed banking facilities to this heavily populated area. Work on the new Chinhoyi Branch has commenced with building scheduled for completion in early 1992.

The Bank has committed some \$30 million, over a threeyear period, to finance small enterprises and co-operatives. A Small Business Services Division has been established for this purpose and to meet the project evaluation and consultancy needs of the small enterprise sector. Head Office Exchange Control and the Blocked Accounts Department have been integrated and are housed in premises in Angwa Street, where the new Small Business Services Division is also situated.

A new Agency to services Division is also situated.

A new Agency to service the Ruwa Growth point outside Harare will open shortly. It is also proposed to provide, in Harare, a new branch and larger Training Centre premises to replace the present congested training facilities. A new branch catering solely for foreign travel requirements, particularly of casual clients, will be opened shortly in Angwa Street, Harare, to relieve the pressure on foreign counters at other branches in the capital. Future plans also include refurbishing Kadoma and Jason Moyo Street branches and enlarging the Plumtree Branch enlarging the Plumtree Branch.

The difficult and protracted collective barganing exercise conducted in July 1990, between the commercial banks and those staff represented by the Zimbabwe Society of Bank Officials, resulted in substantial salary increases for staff. It was also possible to award salary increases to those senior staff who had not been permitted to receive any meaningful increase for some years. However, these salary increases, together with a 13% increase in the Bank's staff complement to service expansion. make it even more imperative to to service expansion, make it even more imperative to increase productivity to keep staff costs down. Hence the importance the Bank places on staff training and development.

At the Bank's Training Centre, existing programmes and trainers' skills were improved and new courses were introduced. Overall, 677 employees attended courses at the Centre. The six graduate trainees who completed their training were posted to branches while nine of the twelve graduates recruited at the start of the year successfully completed the first part of their training. Six staff members were selected for the accelerated Management Training and Development Programme and Six management attended courses cutside Zimbahwa. The Training six managers attended courses outside Zimbabwe. The Training Centre also ran courses for staff recruited for Zimbank Botswana Limited and for SWAPO cadres being trained for positions in financial institutions in Namibia.

SYFRETS MERCHANT BANK LIMITED

Sybank continued to grow and produced satisfactory results once again. Net after-tax income, after transfers to inner reserves, amounted to \$6,261 million, an increase of 24,9%. Total assets, at \$807 million, exceeded last year's figure by \$292 million, or 57%. The expected share capital increase mentioned last year did not materialise. However, it is still required and it is now proposed that Zimbank be requested to take up new shares during the coming financial year. In the interim, the opportunity has been taken of the improved the interim, the opportunity has been taken of the improved results to more than double, to \$2,27 million, the transfer to revenue reserve.

Sybank, along with other Zimbabwean banks, participated during the year in an external line of credit from the International Finance Corporation totalling US\$130 million. This facility will be used to finance export-oriented projects in Zimbabwe and it is anticipated that drawings will commence

SCOTFIN LIMITED

The Company again produced very good results despite the monetary policy changes announced by the Reserve Bank, which particularly affected the finance houses. It is still too early to gauge accurately the overall effect on the Company of the changes in interest rates, except that the initial reduction announced in December 1989 was greater than the subsequent increase announced in August 1990. Nevertheless, net after-tax income after transfers to reserve for contingencies rose by 40%, from \$1,65 million to \$2,31 million.

In January 1990 Scotfin concluded negotiations with the International Finance Corporation for a US\$7,5 million offshore line of credit for the importation of commercial vehicles. The vehicles acquired through the line were allocated to commercial vehicle operators to spread the benefit to the economy as widley as possible. This line will only generate income in the coming francial year. income in the coming financial year.

The issued share capital was increased by \$500 000 to \$5,5 million during the year. In view of the good results and in line with Group policy, the Company has again taken the opportunity to increase retentions. This measure, together with the additional share capital, has increased its borrowing base to ca'er for the new business expected from trade liberalisation and from the IFC line of credit.

IMBANK BOTSWANA LIMITED

Zimbank Botswana Limited opened its doors to the public on 7 May 1990 providing a full range of banking services at Beta House Branch adjacent to the heavy industrial, commrcial and Government areas in Gaborone. The International Department located in Zimbank House in the Mall, Gaborone, provides a comprehensive range of foreign exchange related services and links with foreign correspondents, Interest in the Bank is very strong and by 30 September 1990 over 2000 accounts had been opened at Beta House Branch.

Due to the early stage of operations and start-up costs, a loss was incurred at 30 September 1990. The underlying trend is, however, very encouraging and profitability should be achieved in 1991. The rapid rate of growth has placed considerable pressure on Beta House Branch and plans are well advanced for opening a second branch in Gaborone by the end of this year followed, early next year, by a branch in Francistown.

SYFRETS TRUST & EXECUTOR LIMITED

The Company's profit forecast for the year was exceeded. Will nominations continue to be received at a satisfactory rate and surpassed the record number experiencd in 1988/89.

Assets under the control of the Company increased by 50% and now exceed \$9 million. Asset values, especially of fixed property, have risen considerably over the year, effectively cushioning the inability to date to secure an increase in flees. Any levelling off of property values could have a negative effect on the future performance of the Company, particularly if executor fees continue at the levels at which they have remained for many years. The Trus ee Debenture Scheme continued to grow with stock in issue increasing by 29,7%, to a record \$43,8 million, and total mortgage loans advanced increasing by 13,5%, to a record \$38 million,

DATA CENTRE (PRIVATE) LIMITED

The most important undertaking for Data Centre during the past year has been preparing for the installation of the Total Concepts Financial System banking application package and linking the newly introduced net working software to this package. In support of the Group's policy of taking banking to the rural areas, computer processing capabilities were installed at Mount Darwin Branch, to enable that Branch to operate on the same footing as its urban counterparts. The Zimbank Botswana operations were brought on stream which necessitated modifying the existing computerised system to cater for requirements peculiar to Botswana. The public shares registration system, developed with Sybank initially for the Bank's Rights Issue last year, is now also being used by the Bank's Rights Issue last year, is now also being used by the Bank for administering other new share issues being listed on the Zimbabwe Stock Exchange.

ASSOCIATED COMPANY

The Willis Faber Group continued as one of Zimbabwe's leading insurance brokers catering for all sectors of the community, from major corporate companies to the man in the street. In spite of considerable competition in the insurance broking market, operating results continued to improve in the year under review.

DIRECTORATE

Dr. K. L. Dube, appointed to the Board of Scotfin Limited on 18 January 1990 resigned as a Director of that Company on 8 October 1990 following his appointment as Zimbabwe's Ambassador to France. I thank him for his services to Scotfin Ambassador to France. I thank him for his services to Scotfin and wish him every success in his new appointment. Dr. L. L. Tsumba, Mr. A. O'Dwyer and Mr. A. D. Henchie, with Mr. G. Z. Mpabanga as alternate to Mr. Henchie, were appointed to the Board of Zimbank Botswana Limited with Dr. Tsumba as Chairman and Mr. O'Dwyer as Managing Director. There have been no other changes to the composition of the principal operating subsidiary companies of the Group since the last Annual General Meeting. the last Annual General Meeting.

PERSONNEL

To my colleagues on the Group Boards I express my sincere appreciation for their valuable contributions and support during the past year. On their behalf I extend sincere thanks to the Group Chief Executive, Managing Directors, General Management and Staff of all Group Companies whose efforts produced the good results achieved during the past year.

SHERIFF'S SALES

Conditions of sale

- 1. The sale is conducted in terms of the rules of the High Court, which provide that it shall be without reserve but subject to the condition that the Sheriff requires to be satisfied that the highest price offered is reasonable, having regard to the circumstances of time and place and the state of the property.
- 2. After the auction, a report on the bidding and on the highest price offered, together with any other relevant information relating to the sale, will be forwarded to the Sheriff, who, if satisfied that the highest price offered is reasonable, having regard to the circumstances of time and place and the state of the property, will declare the highest bidder to be the purchaser.
- 3. In terms of the rules of court, any person having an interest in the sale may, within seven days of the Sheriff having declared the highest bidder to be the purchaser, apply to the High Court to have it set aside on the grounds that the sale was improperly conducted or the property was sold for an unreasonably low sum, or any other good ground.
- 4. In the event of no application being made within the said period of seven days, the Sheriff shall confirm the sale.
- 5. During the auction, should any dispute arise as to any bid the property will be put up for sale again.
- 6. The right is reserved to the auctioneer of regulating or refusing any bid.
- 7. The sale shall be for cash and, in addition, the purchaser shall pay—
 - (a) the auctioneer's commission; and
 - (b) the costs of transfer, including conveyancer's charges, stamp-duty and any other fees; and
 - (c) all arrear rates and charges, and any other expenses necessary to complete the transfer.
- 8. Immediately after conclusion of the auction, the highest bidder shall, unless other arrangements are made with the auctioneer, deposit with the auctioneer an amount sufficient to cover the auctioneer's commission, and either—
 - (a) advise the Commissioner appointed by the Sheriff, attending the sale, of the manner in which he intends to make payment of the purchase-price and other costs and charges in terms of these conditions, and satisfy the Commissioner as to his bona fides and ability to meet his obligations; or
 - (b) effect payment to the Commissioner of the whole of the purchase-price in cash or by cheque or bank draft drawn to the order of the Sheriff.
- 9. The purchase-money, if not paid in full to the Commissioner at the conclusion of the auction, shall be paid on or before the registration of the transfer of the property into the name of the purchaser, unless the Sheriff approves other arrangements for discharging the amount due by the purchaser.
- 10. The purchaser shall be liable to pay interest at the rate of nine per cent. per annum in respect of any unpaid balance of the purchase-price, with effect from seven days after the date of confirmation of the sale by the Sheriff.
- 11. If the purchaser fails to make payment of the purchase-price and other costs and charges in terms of these conditions of sale, or fails to comply with any conditions of the sale contained herein, the Sheriff shall have the right to apply to a judge of the High Court to have the sale cancelled, and to hold the purchaser liable for any loss or damages sustained, or to employ any other remedy which he may have.
